ven David, the experienced shepherd-king, depended on God to reveal to him the way he should go. He prays, "Show me the path where I should walk, O Lord; point out the right road for me to follow. Lead me by your truth and teach me, for you are the God who saves me. All day long I put my hope in you." (Psalm 25:4-5, NIV) In another translation, David's prayer is more of a demand than a request: "Make me know Your ways, O Lord; Teach me Your paths." (25:4, NASV) This reveals a deep hunger and need for God to reveal what David's next steps were to be. Embedded in this text is a revelation of the character of God: God is capable of leading us by His own truth. God is our teacher in whom our salvation lies. God is someone in whom we place our hope. So David's request of God to show him the way reveals the heart of God to guide us in choosing the right road ahead of us. God is faithful to do just that for us.

For the nearly one hundred fifty people who attended BIH's IN THE WORD Hawai'i Bible Conference last month, God was faithful in leading and guiding the gathered community into a deeper knowledge and wisdom of the Bible. BIH sponsored our second IN THE WORD event in partnership with the Salvation Army Kroc Center Hawai'i at their beautiful campus in Ewa Beach. The purpose of the event was to have us encounter God's word in new and meaningful ways, to have God's word empower us through ten breakout sessions, and to enrich us toward a faithfulness that will result in a fruitful life as a Christian.



We began with a general session that encouraged everyone to cultivate a teachable heart. We then selected throughout the day three breakout sessions out of the ten offered. They spanned a range of topics including the book of Habakkuk by Dr. Kent Keith, the Temptations of Jesus and the Divided Heart by Rev. Todd Capen, Biblical Counseling and Discipleship by Dr. Mike Dugal, the book of Philippians by Dr. Randy Furushima, Relational Intelligence: The Proverbs Pattern by Dr. Steven Hostetter, How to Read the Bible with Leadership Eyes by Gary Lau, First Corinthians by Rev. Dr. Gordon Marchant, the book of Revelation by Dr. Matt Sanders, the Lord's Prayer by Dr. Martha Stinton, and the Kingdom of God by Dr. Rick Stinton.



IH has received news that Dr. Neff went to meet the Lord on October 8, 2019. He was a full-time teacher at BIH for four years (1988-1991) before retiring to Crossville, Tennessee to be closer to his family. For many years following retirement he continued his ministry to BIH by serving as adjunct faculty during our Winter Quarter. Many in the BIH family will remember fondly Bob and his wife, Eivor, during their years of service at BIH, their vibrant faith and infectious iov. He was extraordinary in his knowledge of the Bible, having earned his Doctor of Theology degree from Concordia Seminary. He was remarkably gifted as a teacher

and communicator. Prior to serving at BIH, Bob and Eivor served as Lutheran missionaries in Malaysia and Singapore, and then as pastor at Advent Lutheran Church (Tennessee) for nine years. In a 1988 interview with Ada Lum published in this newsletter. Bob was asked what he saw in BIH that made him decide to teach here. His response was that "much of what BIH did both in theory and spirit in [training lay people in the Bible] was the kind of thing I always liked and believed in." Bob has fought the good fight, finished the course, and kept the faith (2 Timothy 4:7). Let us keep in our hearts his memory, and keep in prayer Eivor, his four daughters, and eight grandchildren.


