
SUMMONS TO FAITH by Dr. Randy Furushima, BIH Executive Director

he writer of Psalm 77 has something to say to us as we continue to live under the challenge and discouragement of a continuing pandemic affecting the entire world. I shared this psalm at our recent BIH Board Meeting as we exchanged ideas on how BIH was going to proceed into the summer and fall seasons. The inspiration of Psalm 77 came to me through one of my mentors of faith, Walter Brueggemann, who has written a book titled Virus as a Summons to Faith: Biblical Reflections in a Time of Loss. Grief, and Anxiety (Cascade Books, 2020). Brueggemann observes rightly that the psalmist begins with the first six verses centered on himself, and not on God. Expressions include: "I cry out loud to God . . . I look for my Lord . . . I remember God . . . I moan . . . I complain . . . I'm so upset . . . I think about days long past ... I remember. . . I meditate . . . " (Ps. 77:1-6, CEB). These early verses are filled with "I." How can we blame the psalmist? He is in a desperate and troubled state. Of course he will think only of himself as many of us would do in the same situation, and some of us have done for the many months we have been sequestered.

This self-concern takes a turn after these first six verses with a set of guestions meant to make us reflect: "Will my LORD reject me forever? Will he never be pleased again? Has his faithful love come to a complete end? Is his promise over for future generations? Has God forgotten how to be gracious? Has he angrily stopped up his compassion?" (Ps. 77:7-9, CEB). These questions are embedded in

the harsh perspective we might develop when we believe God has abandoned us with his goodness and kindness. Perhaps you have thought of these questions yourselves as you try to make sense in our Christian faith about what God is doing with us through COVID-19.

After asking these questions, the psalmist changes his focus and begins to recall the works of the LORD and the wonders God did in the past. His words then change into praise and affirmation of the character and witness of God in life – God's power and sovereignty over creation and all of life (Ps. 77:11-20). What a change and transformation this is! God requires us to be honest about how we are feeling, as depicted in Psalm 77:1-6. But God doesn't want us to remain there. There must be a time when our faith is summoned to remember and celebrate who God is and has been for us. We call this worship as (Continued on page 3)

n 1989 I met with linguistics professor Joseph Grimes, while I was Dean of Students at Hawai'i Loa College, now Hawai'i Pacific University. Joe was a professor from Cornell University and teaching at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. Joe had heard of my time at SIL (Summer Institute Linguistics), which is the training arm of Wycliffe Bible Translators, the world's largest organization that translates Scriptures into the languages of tribal peoples. Joe asked me one question: "Do you think Hawai'i needs a Bible in Hawai'i Pidgin?" I still remember my (Continued on page 4)

The book of Ruth has been regarded as one of the most lovable and fascinating stories in the Bible. It begins as a story of a woman who journeys back to Bethlehem with her mother-in-law, after the deaths of both of their husbands. Adding interest to this is that Ruth is a Moabite, a foreigner belonging to an archenemy of Israel, and yet becomes the grandmother of Israel's greatest king, David. Ruth is a story of *hesed* (loyal devotion) and of diligence and kindness. At its center is a love story between Ruth and Naomi, Ruth and Boaz, and ultimately between God and His people. The Acts of the Apostles: Thirty Years That Changed the World

Acts is the pivotal book in the New Testament, looking back to the Gospels and forward to the Letters. It is the sequel to the gospel story written by Luke. In Acts, the disciples witness Jesus ascending into heaven and the Holy Spirit coming on the day of Pentecost. We will trace the origin and growth of the Christian movement between the years of A.D. 30-60 as it expands from Jerusalem westward to Rome. Acts is the story of the triumphs and trials of early Christianity, including the passions that drove it and the source of power that energized it. Any Christian who wants to know how to be a disciple of Christ should study Acts to know how the first Christians lived. It is an important building block in understanding the rest of the New Testament.



response, "Yes, if it's done well." I was moved when I saw the story of Jesus' baptism on the wall at the baptism site near the Jordan River in Hawai'i Pidgin. Millions around the world have witnessed this remarkable translation. When the New Testament was completed as Da Jesus Book in 2000, the response was overwhelmingly positive. Hundreds of people saw this translation as a way to reach family members and friends in a

language and style that was faithful to the original languages of Scripture as well as being understood easily, especially when read aloud.

The vision for the Hawai'i Pidgin Bible project always included the completion of the Old Testament. We can celebrate the fact that now it has been completed. I recently spoke with Earl Morihara who has been given the key oversite role for the completion of this extraordinary endeavor.

Randy: What will the Hawai'i Pidgin Bible with both Old and New Testaments be called?

Earl: The New Testament was called Da Jesus Book, and has been revised since its 2000 publication in the complete Bible, which will be called Da Good an Spesho Book.

Randy: What has been the response to the Hawai'i Pidgin Bible?

Earl: Many people have been using Da Jesus Book since 2000, and for the past twenty years we have been persevering in our vision to translate and publish the entire Old Testament. People are excited to now have the complete Bible to use in ministry.

Randy: What lies ahead for the project?

Earl: An audio version of Da Jesus Book is now in the works. Auditions for the many voice roles are now being scheduled.

Randy: What would you like to communicate to the BIH community about the Hawai'i Pidgin Bible?

Earl: For those who speak, or know those who speak Hawai'i Pidgin, the Standard English versions may speak to the head, but this version will speak to their heart.
