Two Years In: HOPE we are in the clear.

ince the onset of the pandemic and throughout its lingering and unwelcome stay. I remember questioning the wisdom of having a large gathering celebration. People have experienced serious losses of loved ones, of jobs, even of homes. Also, the pandemic along with financial pressures triggered waves of mental health issues often linked to social isolation, addiction, depression, and anxiety. The way we work, the way we learn,

even the way we worship has all changed.

As time passed, I found myself using the word, "hope" more and more. I may have even declared a time or two, "Yes, we're in the clear, the pandemic is on the way out, make plans to reopen!" ... and then one year later ... "Now, we are in the clear...I hope? Should we move forward with the plans?" I answered myself, "YES absolutely, things are better right?...I hope?"

Most likely not used with the same biblical image that the Apostle Paul had in mind when he used the word, "hope."

I used the word hope to convey wishful thinking, what I wish to do or wish to see happen. It was my means of dealing with angst and anxiety about current circumstance and about the future. Interestingly, Paul uses the word "hope" in Romans 15:13 in an "otherworldly" way. He masterfully redirects our attention away from any worrisome future. It states, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Our hearts are easily set adrift by worry and the unending cycle of potential outcomes-What could happen, what should happen, or what may or may not happen. Instead, our eyes must be fixed on the God who is, the God of Hope, the God of our present, as well as our future. He is the anchor of our hearts, who keeps us from going astray. When we yield to the Spirit and wait upon Him, He IS the outcome and overflow of lasting joy and peace! Our Blessed HOPE! (Titus 2:13)


