## ■ Keynote Address Speakers

### **Rod Franklin via video, BIH Executive Director, 1992-1998.**

Through digital recording, Pastor Rod Franklin delivered his address, "Today, looking back to celebrate, yes! And leaning forward to what God will do and continue to do in His work with BIH." He described his first-class experience with Pastor Don Baron, BIH's founder. As a BIH student in the 70s, Rod was impressed by the diversity of students representing different cultures, denominations, and religious experiences. He quoted a motto statement for the classes, "People Grow More, Know More, and Love More." He shared the story of how he became BIH's second ED and what a blessing the ministry was to him and his wife. In closing, he introduced the three Award Honorees, asking us to imagine the number of lives they each impacted (thousands!) and because of these thousands, how many more lives have been touched.

### **Randy Furushima, BIH Executive Director, 2018-2021.**

Pastor Randy's connection to BIH began in the 7th grade when he studied under then-future teacher Ada Lum. "Each of us thought we were her favorite student," he joked. He had begun his address by listing several references to the number "50" in the Bible. The fiftieth year was also called the Jubilee year (Lev. 25:10), when liberty was proclaimed and debts forgiven, a cause for celebration. However, in its tragic history, Israel became immersed in wickedness, a likely result of neglect and absence of the Book of the Law, explained Pastor Randy. A rediscovery of the Scriptures during the reign of King Josiah

brought an awakening, repentance, and reform to the land. Pastor Randy stressed the importance of the work and people who support it. "BIH is only as strong and distinctive as its people...who are they? YOU...who have supported the vision, mission, and values of this unique organization." In closing, he invited people to pray and give to the ministry of BIH, supporting its work, so it will continue into the future and its centennial year.

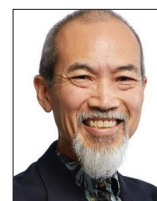
As we look to the horizon of the New Year and beyond, may I invite you to join us in a commitment to growing in God's Word together? Growth is a process that is gradual; sometimes it goes unnoticed, requiring patience. But maturity and the continuation of growth requires some intentionality and planning. Neglect will cause the opposite effect or worse. Now we can't "make" ourselves or someone else grow spiritually. That's God's job. We can, however, control the environment that best fosters growth. In other words, we can arrange and structure our lives in such a way that sets up the best outcome for spiritual growth. In reflecting on a gardener's expertise and the Parable of the Sower, the planting of a seed will usually produce a seedling from the energy stored in the seed. But sustained and optimal growth happens when the gardener does what is necessary to give that seedling a fighting chance. This involves irrigating the soil with the right amount of water, allowing for the right amount of sunlight, protecting the plant from weeds and pests, and providing a constant source of nutrients back into the soil.

First, put yourself in places that best expose you to the necessary nutrients of God's Word. It starts with us, so simply pick up the Bible, open it, and read it. Like sunlight, get exposed to it and get exposed by it. Start anywhere. Read anywhere. Just start reading...TODAY!

Allow the light's rays to expose those weeds that do not belong in your garden; allow it to speak to your heart, and act on it. It is a lifetime commitment.

You say you're reading already? Great! Now, read the Bible...with others. Read it in community, anywhere, online or in-person. Go where it is taught and talked about. Start with prayer, dig deeper, reach further, and allow the Holy Spirit to draw you closer to Himself and with others. The more you read, the more questions are raised. The more questions you ask, the more you read the Bible to seek answers. More reading, more questions, more searching, more reading. As soon as you ask, "why or how?" further reading ensues with instigation. That is beginning of Bible Study.

Drop-in to "Just Show Up"; we meet weekly online for the reading of Scripture. Show up consistently and eventually you'll read through the entire Bible. Of course, one place comes to mind that offers a great set of teaching faculty, where you can study along with like-minded students. But first, let me strongly recommend a place to encourage your Bible reading - your church and worshipping community. Don't discount those key spiritual relationships. Get involved in the life of the church and posture your heart towards learning from your Pastor(s), Elder(s) and Teacher(s). After solidifying that, then browse through our Newsletter for Courses and Seminars, or study tours. If you struggle with discipline, consider the CBS certificate program. This program will help keep you on track. If nothing piques your interest now, I would love to hear from you and explore how our programs could better address your interests and needs.
