

In their foundational session, they underscored the significance of sacrificial love within marital relationships, highlighting that we are inherently created to express love in this manner. When individuals imitate Christ, they exemplify His sacrificial love. Embracing and practicing sacrificial love leads to the fullest satisfaction for both partners within the relationship. as succinctly stated by the Friesens: "We were designed to love sacrificially. When we love sacrificially, we are most fully like Christ. When we imitate Christ, we are living out His design. When we live out His design, we are both most fully satisfied."

Pastors in attendance also praised the Friesens' unique ability to connect with attendees, both on stage and in personal interactions. Their seamless teamwork, combined with an unwavering commitment to truth and selfless godly love, was noted as a high calling in marriages. Couples and singles alike expressed hope for the institution of marriage, recognizing it as a sacred covenant worth protecting, preserving, and prioritizing.
