## Finding God's Hand in the Midst of Fear:

### A Journey of Trust in Africa

I thoroughly enjoyed taking **Dr. Elaine Eng's class** last year entitled, "Discovering Your Spiritual Narrative." In it we learned how to write our own Spiritual Autobiographies. Here is an excerpt from mine.

In the summer of 2000, I decided on a trip to Africa to visit missionary friends in Mozambique and then join friends on a safari in Tanzania. Travelling alone from Hawaii to Africa was a scary proposition and I began to get cold feet. After much prayer I felt assured by God that He would protect me despite recent reports of robbers attacking missionaries and rhinos attacking anyone. So, I headed out, landing in South Africa to be greeted by friends for a safari and then on to their home in Mozambique. It was a rich and challenging time of watching my missionary friends living selfless lives, as they trusted in the Lord in ways I had never imagined.

With renewed confidence, I was next ready to meet my friends from Hawaii for our safari in Tanzania. Upon arriving at the airport, I found that my connecting flight had been cancelled. I was in shock and no longer in control of anything: no cell phones, no English, no customer service, no explanation, no communication, no help! It was a terrifying 48 hours when I was sure I was stuck in Africa forever. I felt so alone and that God had totally abandoned me even after He had promised His protection. I was simultaneously angry and petrified with fear, all the while not noticing how God was in fact, rescuing me.

My friend was able to contact a missionary couple in South Africa, and a new flight plan was hatched. I found an American woman sitting in a group of chairs by an unmarked gate and trusted that she knew more than I did. During the whole trip I chatted nervously away in English, all the

while totally shaken with fear. At the gate I was met by a cheerful couple who took me to lunch and then on to another lady who fed me dinner and gave me a room with dogs guarding my door. In the morning, I was given a ride and put on a flight to Kenya with connections to Tanzania. More adventures ensued.

It wasn't until later while pouring my heart out in my journal, that it all became clear. Oh, those amazing, unknowable ways of the Lord.

From my journal:

"I took a trip to Africa that was scary, stretching, and unforgettable in a way that nothing else has ever been for me. I met a puff adder, flamingoes, herds of everything, and a monkey who stole my lunch. I spent 8 hours in "the bush" with my missionary friend, visiting a tiny church on logs facing a lake, praying for tithes in a thatched covered hut with rain dripping thru, and in a dark room where I preached to young men with only a flashlight. I got to visit a rescue orphanage across from a smoking garbage dump where children were pulled back to life and love and purpose. I felt colors and kindness and the precious harmony of children's voices. And I met **God in the midst of terror, fear, anger and helplessness, as He was rescuing me.** On a trip to Africa, I had a new epiphany of my God whose promises are true!"

The two lessons I learned on that trip have served me well. As much as we love being in control, **when we're not, is when God can do His most amazing work. And, that He is always, ALWAYS working behind the scenes for our good and His glory.**

**In Memoriam:**  
**REV. NELSON YOUNG CHUL KWON**  
 (1926–2025)

It is with heartfelt remembrance that we honor **Rev. Nelson Young Chul Kwon**, a beloved former faculty member of the **Bible Institute of Hawaii**, who peacefully passed away on **May 18, 2025, at the age of 99**. Born and raised on Oahu,

Nelson's life was marked by dedicated service—as a pastor at multiple churches across Hawaii, a passionate Bible teacher at BIH, and a joyful choir leader. Known for his deep understanding of Scripture and his heartfelt commitment to students, he continued sharing his love for God even in his final months.

Nelson is survived by **his wife of 62 years, Grace**, their sons and grandchildren, and his sister. He will be remembered as a faithful husband, father, teacher, and servant of Christ, whose warmth, humor, and resilience touched many lives.

A memorial service was held on Saturday, **July 26, at Makiki Christian Church**, with hundreds in attendance, celebrating Nelson's life and legacy.

Nelson Kwon, a devoted pastor and Bible teacher, played a special role in many lives. **Bong Rin Ro**, who also served on the faculty of BIH, shared this heartfelt remembrance:

"At my wedding on June 15, 1963, Nelson Kwon, whom I had never met until that day, served as my best man—a remarkable testament to the strength of Christian friendship and community. At the time, I was studying at Covenant Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, and my fiancée, **Alma**, was preparing for our wedding in Honolulu. Since I did not know anyone in Hawaii, Alma asked her classmate Grace from Roosevelt High School to request her Korean fiancé Nelson to be my best man. Nelson and Grace were also planning their own wedding just two months later, in August 1963. Despite meeting for the first time only at our wedding, Nelson embraced his role wholeheartedly, marking the beginning of a lifelong friendship.

"Nelson and I shared many commonalities beyond that day. Both of us are Korean by heritage—Nelson was Hawaiian-born to immigrant parents, while I was an international student from Korea.

Alma and Grace were classmates active in Christian Fellowship at Roosevelt High School. Nelson and I both graduated from Wheaton College in Illinois, Nelson earning his BA and MA in the early 1950s, and I received my BA in 1962. And most significantly, both of us dedicated over fifty years to Christian ministry—Nelson as a United Church of Christ pastor serving numerous congregations across Hawaii and as a conference pastor, and I in mission work and teaching throughout Asia and Hawaii. We were also privileged to serve together on the faculty of BIH.

"Nelson was a wonderful servant of Christ whom God had used in Hawaii. He is in heaven with Christ, and I am looking forward to seeing him there in the future."

Former BIH staff member **Joanne Naai** shared how Pastor Kwon first became associated with Bible Institute of Hawaii:

"Thirty years ago, hunger for Bible classes was growing and BIH was struggling to keep up with the demand for more class offerings. More teachers were needed. **Ada Lum**, senior faculty member at the time, said, 'I know of no finer Bible teacher than Nelson Kwon. Let's ask him if he'd be willing to teach.' He was willing, and in this way, many students outside of the UCC denomination were blessed to be able to study the Scriptures under his guidance and scholarship.

"Any student in Pastor Kwon's class knew that Bible study was to be taken seriously. There was homework: reading, analysis, and thought-provoking questions to aid class discussions. Those who finished a course would find themselves with a deeper and richer understanding of God's Word, and a closer relationship with Jesus Christ, for Pastor Kwon would remind students that the study of God's Word must always lead to Christ."

**Michelle Saito**, who witnessed Nelson's commitment at Makiki Christian Church, added: "Pastor Kwon began teaching Bible classes immediately after transferring to Makiki Christian Church seven years ago. Despite medical challenges, he continued faithfully teaching up to the end, finishing Revelation just three months before his passing. His dedication was an inspiration to all."

**A Makiki Christian Church member** also recalls his passion for teaching with a smile: "One day, walking past a classroom, I heard his booming voice say, 'You didn't do the reading!' It made me chuckle, but he was right students should come prepared!"

Nelson's legacy as a **faithful servant of Christ**, a devoted teacher, and a beloved friend remains strong. Though he has passed on, we look forward to the day when we will meet again.

## History of Christianity in China (in Mandarin)

Dr. Shan Chen

It's been well over a millennium since the Nestorians first brought Christianity to China during the Tang Dynasty (618-907). The survival and growth of this "foreign"

religion have been subject to the political needs and even the whims of dynastic rulers. It was not until the arrival of the Protestant missionaries in the early 19th century and the production of the Chinese-language Bible that facilitated the indigenization of Christianity in China. The exponential growth of Chinese Christians in the last fifty years in the wake of decades of suppression indicates a strong resilience in the Chinese Church.

The statement "all history is contemporary history" (Benedetto Croce, Italian philosopher, 1866-1952) points to the interpretative nature of historical events. More than just a look at the past, this course intends to explore the interaction between Christianity and Chinese culture, how the Chinese Church can continue to grow, to form a strong voice in world Christianity and to play an instrumental role in fulfilling the Great Commission.
